

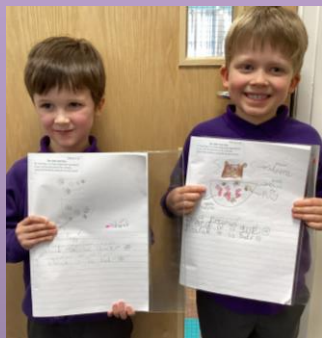
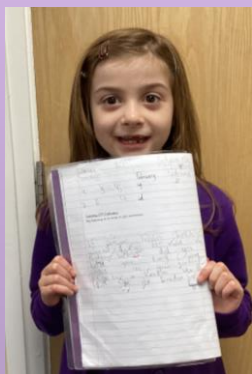
A Message from Mrs Kee

Our assembly on Monday was about Food Waste Action Week (18th – 24th March).

The children discovered some key facts about the impact of food waste. For example, did you know that every day the equivalent of 20 million slices of bread are thrown away in UK homes? This could have fed breakfast to 10 million people! The children were challenged to find out more about preventing food waste, such as only buying what you need and freezing left over food. We also talked about eating what is on their plate. Thanks to the children that researched and brought in a list of foods that can be safely frozen!

I have really enjoyed seeing some lovely work from children this week in maths, writing and art. The children talked about the strategies they used in maths and, in Year 2, the children were very excited about something that happened this week – more in the Newsletter! We were visited by our Curriculum-Link Governor who was delighted to look at some children's sketch books with them, listening to them talk about their learning in art.

Remember to think about food waste – encourage your child to eat what is on their plate! If yours are anything like mine, there will probably at least be the odd broccoli stem left though! *Mrs Kee*

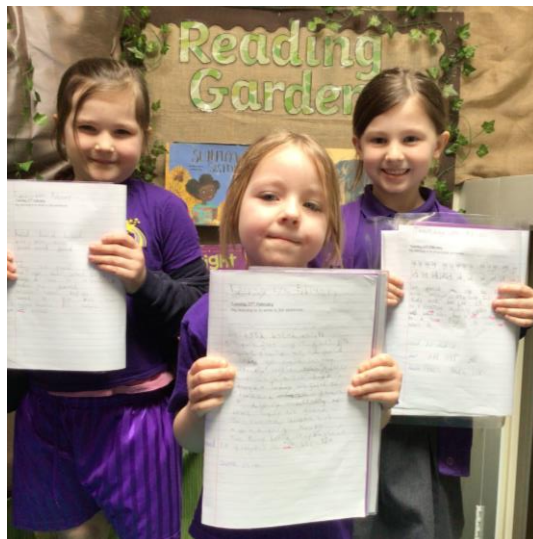
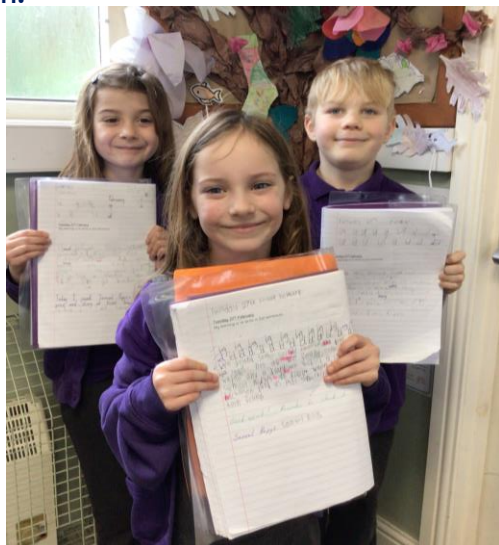


Lovely Learning in Year 2



The children in Year 2 have started learning about the Great Fire of London this week and are enjoying the learning unit so far.

On Tuesday, the Year 2 staff had a message saying that something had been found which was buried at the side of the playground. The children were extremely excited about this and went to investigate during their English lesson. Much to their amazement, they discovered an old diary, a red wine bottle and some very smelly cheese hidden in a box! After looking at the sources further, the children were delighted to find out that the items actually belonged to the famous diarist, Samuel Pepys! Back in class, the children wrote all about this and carried on reading Pepys' diary to learn more about the devastating fire which happened back in 1666 in London.





Love Food, Hate Waste

After learning about the impact of food waste in assembly, Mrs Kee challenged the children to find out and write a list of foods that can be frozen. Several children rose to the challenge! Did you know that all of these foods can be frozen - sausages, chops and most other raw meat, most fruit and vegetables (although you'll usually need to cook or blend them after freezing), leftovers such as rice, bread, milk (it will separate but is fine once defrosted), batch cooked meals (eg lasagne)?

World Book Day is on **Thursday 7th March**. *Children can come to school dressed in their pyjamas or onesies for a special book-focused day!*

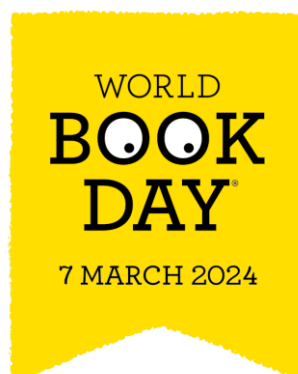
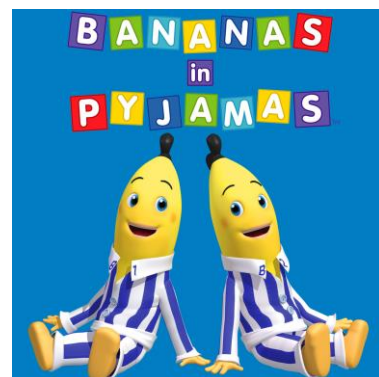
