A Message from Mrs Kee

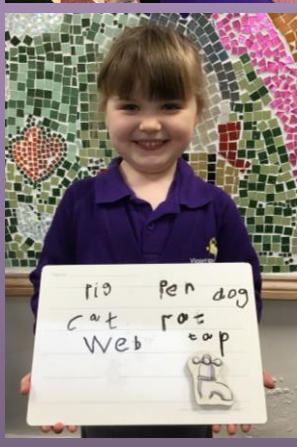

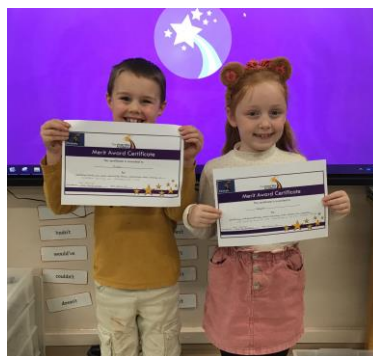

Flu Immunisations - Reminder

The Flu Immunisation Team will soon be coming to Violet Way for our whole school children's nasal spray flu immunisations on **Wednesday 1st December**. In advance of this, they require parents to fill out a consent form.

The deadline for completing the form will be **9:00am on 29th November 2021.**

This vaccination is delivered by a nasal spray and recommended to help protect your child against flu. Vaccinating your child will also help protect more vulnerable family and friends by preventing the spread of flu. With COVID-19 still in circulation, it is important to reduce the number of those becoming ill with flu this winter to help protect them, the NHS and social care. This vaccination is free and is a quick and simple spray up the nose. Even if your child had it last year, it is recommended to have the flu vaccine again this year.
