A Message from Mrs Kee

This week has been full of exciting curriculum experiences! As part of their unit of learning ‘Around the world’, the children in Reception enjoyed a visit to the Chinese restaurant ‘Wing Wah’s’ in Burton. During the visit they tasted Chinese food, tried using chopsticks, learnt a few phrases in Mandarin and watched a live traditional dragon dance. They were so excited to tell me all about their trip! Thank you to the EYFS staff, parent volunteers and Mr. Bill for organising and supporting the visits.

In Year 2, the children were visited by Bemma from African Ark who came along to help the children learn about African culture through singing, dancing and storytelling. Bemma shared examples of various dances that are enjoyed in Africa and showed the children the different sounds made by the dancers as they moved. It was a fantastic experience for all our children, helping them to learn about African culture and also think about their own. Experiences like this also help our children to understand and appreciate the similarities and differences between people in the world, reinforcing that we are all individual and very special, linking to our value ‘We celebrate individuality’. It also helps them to understand their place in the global community. Thank you to the Year 2 staff for organizing this experience.

Next week is Children’s Mental Health Week and Internet Safety Day. There will be an assembly on the theme, ‘Growing Together’. Over the week, children will engage in yoga, relaxation exercises, singing, making music, an outdoor activity and a PSHE lesson with a focus on ‘Growing Together’. Teachers will encourage children to think about how these activities make them feel and how they support positive mental health. In their computing lessons next week, the focus will be online safety and they will also listen to online safety stories. We had planned an online safety parent workshop, but as we are not having parents in school currently, there will be a presentation and resources added to the school website instead .



World Book Day

World Book Day is **Thursday 3rd March** and we will be celebrating in school with a dress up day. We would like the children to come into school on this day dressed in their **pyjamas and to bring in their favourite bedtime story**. We would like this story to stay in school for the Thursday and the Friday as part of their learning.

On the Thursday when the children come into school they will start the day with a story and enjoy milk and toast whilst wearing their pyjamas. They will have learning linked to World Book Day on both Thursday 3rd March and Friday 4th March. We will take photos of the children in their pyjamas and they will become the character for their own story! They will then design their own story setting and write about what their character will see and do in this story setting.

Book Fair 2022



Covid continues....

Thank you to parents for supporting us and following advice after a rise in Covid cases in school. Numbers are reducing and we will continue to ensure measures are in place to keep numbers as low as possible. **This means we are not having library sessions with parents until after the half term. Also, we had planned an online safety workshop in school for parents next week, however instead we will upload a presentation, resources and links on our website and share the link via Marvellous Me.**


We will continue to communicate regularly with the Local Authority as appropriate and follow any guidance as required. We continue to monitor the situation daily. Measures in place currently include:

- good hygiene practices, reviewed with children regularly
- ventilation (keeping windows open slightly to allow air flow)
- good cleaning routines
- systems in place for informing close contacts
- staff continue to LFD twice per week and daily if identified as a close contact
- daily testing for close contacts
- anyone with symptoms to isolate straight away and get tested
- parental events postponed currently
- educational visitors asked to wear masks
- risk assessment in place

We are not currently having whole school assemblies in the hall. Children will have their Monday and Friday assemblies in year groups. Mrs Kee continues to regularly review the situation and will keep parents informed.

The diagram opposite explains the current isolation Expectations. You begin isolation the day after Symptoms or a positive test. You have to isolate for at least five full days. You can LFD test on day five and day 6 (24 hours apart) and if both tests are negative, you can finish isolating immediately. If the tests are positive you continue to isolate up to 10 days or when you have two negative tests 24 Hours apart.
