- Able to sound out real and nonsense words with Set 2 and 3 sounds in.
- Fluent and accurate reading of a turquoise level Rigby star book or yellow RWI book (or equivalent)

Writing

Spell year 1 common exception words and silver words

- Write a good sentence with a capital letter at the start, finger spaces and a full stop at the end.
- Think it, say it, write it, check it able to think of sentences and say them aloud before writing them then checking them back.

Maths

- Understand the place value of numbers to 100 eg 45 is not 4 + 5 it is 40 + 5 using base 10 to support this
- Read and write numbers to 100
- Say 1 more 1 less numbers to 100
- Add and subtract numbers using a range of methods and apparatus numicon, number lines, tens frames, part whole, base ten
- Fluent at number bonds to 10 and then 20


