## Family activities


## Make a loo roll bird feeder\_

This is messy fun kids will get stuck into and it will help them learn about the birds in your neighbourhood.

You can make this simple feeder with items you probably already have at home.

- 1) Smother a cardboard tube in peanut butter (no added salt and sugar versions are suitable for birds)
- 2) Rolls it in bird seen and thread some string through the hole.
- 3) Tie it up in your garden where birds will feel safe eating.

How many garden birds will you spot? Can you identify them? Can you keep a tally chart to see which type of bird visits the most?
