Change to snack in September

Following a survey present to parents earlier in the year about snack choices, in September we will be changing our snack menu to offer more variety and choice. We will be setting up a snack menu on ParentPay and parents will be able to order daily, like meals, rather than toast all in one go for the term. You will see two items on ParentPay, main snack and drink snack, with brand new options for your child to choose from, including toast, pancakes, watermelon, milk and apple juice! You can order multiple weeks in one go, or each morning **before 8:00am**.


Wellbeing ideas

The holidays are a wonderful time of year, but they can also be overwhelming and stressful at times. Here are a couple of holiday ideas for children!

Mindfulness dancing - The goal is that they listen to music, then dance in a way that makes them feel good, and notice how their body moves as they dance. Don't overthink this one, just put on some fun music on and get groovin'! Prompts:

- Instruct them to move how they feel their body wants to move and parents, you should get some dancing in too.
- Whatever song comes on, how does your body want to move?
- Why did you want to move that way?

Mindfulness Walk - mindfulness is all about paying attention to the moment in a nonjudgmental way. It can help people connect to their bodies and can also reduce stress. Use the prompts below when going on a mindfulness walk.

How to take part in the challenge

- Visit 2 Once you have read your 3 books visit your local library to return them, and borrow 3 more! Collect your second set of stickers. Did you remember to sign up for an event or activity too!
- Visit 3 Complete your challenge! Return your books and collect your certificate, medal, bookmark and stickers. The reading fun doesn't have to stop there! Why not borrow some more books and continue to be a reading champion!

The Mini Challenge is a bite sized version of the Summer Reading Challenge for our youngest readers. Children collect stickers on a special collector card for the books they borrow and read.
