


Friday 14th October 2022








Oxford Owl eBooks Update

Y1 & Y2 Drama After School Club

On **Monday 17th October at 4:00pm**, a Microsoft Teams Forms will Be shared with Y1 and Y2 parents to be able to sign up their child to a new Drama Club (Rob Adcock Drama School) that is starting after October half term. This club will alternate between year groups each half term, so after Christmas, the places will be offered out again to Y1.

Flu Immunisations

On **Tuesday 1st November**, the MPFT NHS Team will be in school to administer flu immunisations. Flu is a virus which can make you feel very unwell and can cause serious complications. Vaccinating your child will also help protect more vulnerable family members and friends by preventing the spread of flu.

This vaccination is free. It is a quick and simple spray up the nose. Even if your child had it last year, they should have the flu vaccine again this year.

If your child has ASTHMA and there are any changes to their health 14 days before the vaccination date YOU <u>MUST</u> contact the immunisation service on 0300 124 0366 as your child may not be well enough to receive the vaccination.

These include, if your child:

- · Becomes wheezy
- Has required oral steroids
- Has increased their asthma medication

Five reasons to have the flu vaccine

1. Protect your child

The vaccine will help protect your child against flu and serious complications such as bronchitis and pneumonia.

2. Protect you, your family and friends

Vaccinating your child will help protect more vulnerable friends and family.

3. No injection needed

The nasal spray is painless and easy to have.

4. It's better than having flu

The nasal spray helps protect against flu, has been given to millions of children worldwide and has an excellent safety record.


5. Avoid costs


