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Fireworks and Bonfires

Bonfire Night is Saturday. If you are planning to attend a bonfire and firework event, we hope you have a wonderful time. Make sure you stay safe! Despite annual safety warnings, firework celebrations still end in painful injuries for too many people, including very young children. Yet fireworks can be great fun for families, not just around November 5 (Bonfire Night/Guy Fawkes Night), but also Diwali, New Year's Eve and Chinese New Year.



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Injury figures support the advice that the safest place to enjoy fireworks is at a large public display - far fewer people are injured here than at smaller family or private parties. But if you'll be having a firework party at home, you can make the occasion fun and safe for everyone by following the Firework Code, as well as some sparkler and bonfire safety tips. - Sharing with others






















Mrs Kee has been so pleased to see lots of lovely learning this week – well done!





Parent Reading Sessions

Many parents attended our Parent Reading meeting last half term and we have shared the Powerpoint with all parents on the website. Following on from the meeting, we would like to would invite parents into school to join your



child during one of their Read Write Inc (RWI) lessons. Reception children currently have whole class lessons as they learn 'Set 1' sounds. Y1 and Y2 pupils are spilt into groups across the year groups.

By joining your child for their lesson, you will gain further understanding of how we teach reading at school. If you are unable to attend, you can find further information about phonics and reading on our website. Visit the following web pages: English Curriculum, Parent Guide to Phonics.

Parents are invited to join their child for a RWI lesson in school on the following dates (9:00am-9:40am):

Year 1 and 2:

- Monday 21st November Year 2 Kestrels and Year 1 Dragonflies
- Tuesday 22nd November Year 2 Woodpeckers and Year 1 Ladybirds
- Wednesday 23rd November Year 2 Owls and Year 1 Busy Bees

Reception:

- Tuesday 22nd November Squirrels, Foxes and Badgers Group 1
- Wednesday 23rd November Squirrels, Foxes and Badgers Group 2 NB Class teachers will send you a message letting you know if your child is in Group 1 or 2.

On these days you can come into class with your child at the start of the day, where you will be asked to sign in. In Reception, the children will stay in class for their RWI lesson. In Y1 and Y2, parents are asked stay with your child as they go to their reading group. The RWI lesson will finish at 9.40am. At the end of the session, please leave school through the main entrance.

We look forward to welcoming you into school. If you have any questions, please speak to Mrs Williams.

- > Meetings will be chaired by the CEO, Mrs Maria Hamblin.
- ➤ A record of the meeting will be shared with all parents via the usual school communication channels. Parents will act as Trust Parent Forum Members for one year.

This is what the Trust Parent Forum will be responsible for:

- Representing parents' thoughts from across all schools. This could be feedback, suggestions or wishes.
- Giving ideas for ways of improving or strengthening communication between the Trust Board and schools.
- > Acting as a soundboard to the Trust Board on behalf of parents.
- > Championing the Trust and our Trust schools.

It will not be:

- > A forum where personal issues or complaints are resolved or raised.
- A meeting where individual names of staff can be identified or raised in any negative manner.
- A meeting where parents who are vocal take up the time of the group and do not enable all to have representation.

I would welcome parents who would genuinely like to make a difference to step forward. In my experience, parents give a supportive and fair perspective to how we educate their children.
