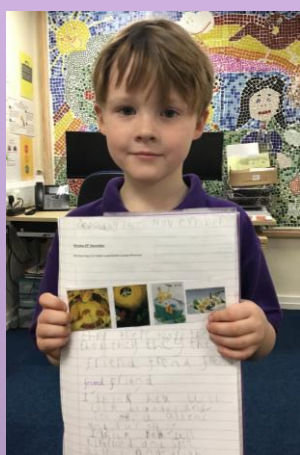

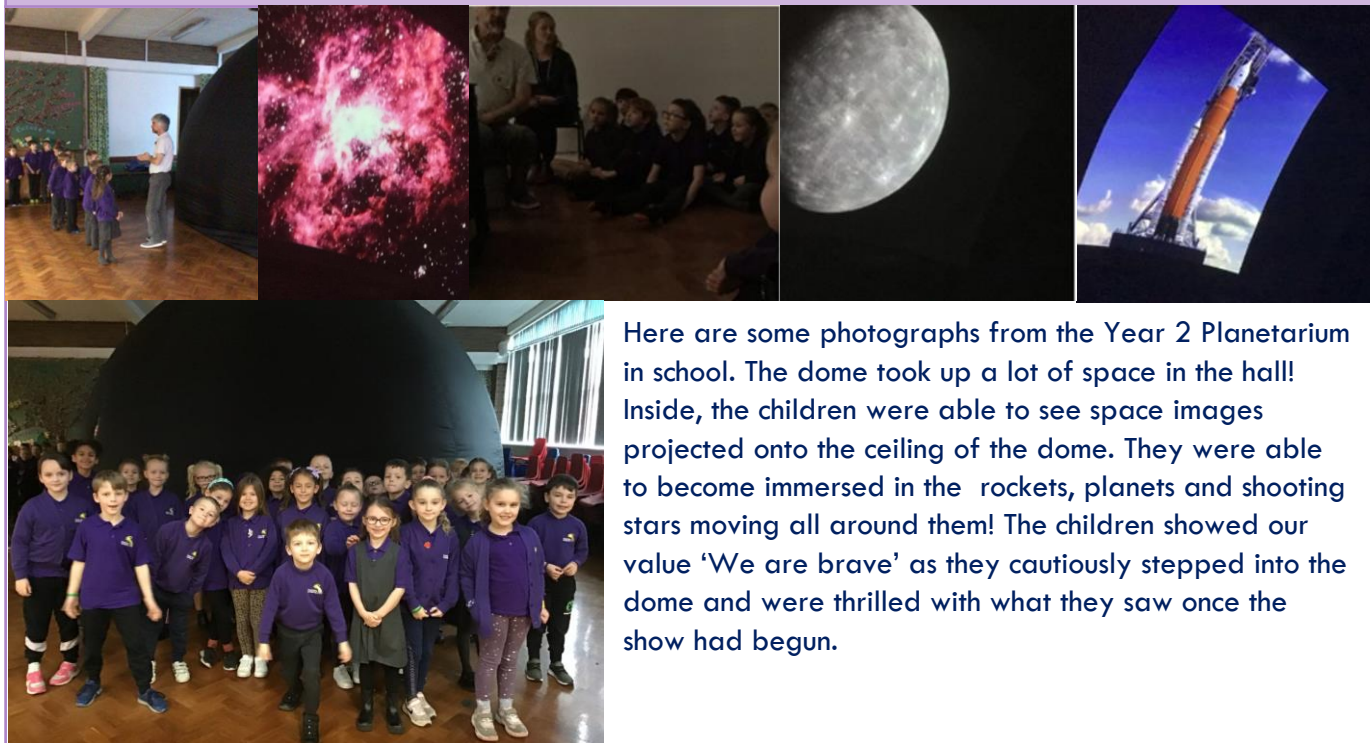


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Year 2 - Planetarium

Children in Need

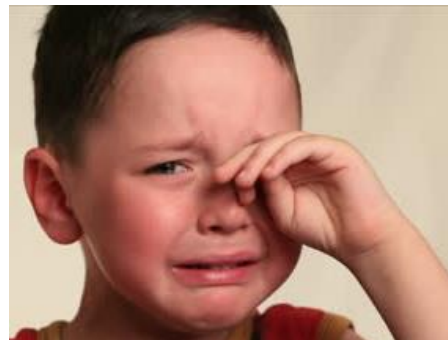

No Trading Thank you!

Although we are happy for children to bring in awards from home to share in our Merit Assembly, or items that they wish to share with their class, please can we remind all parents that children should not be bringing toys in from home. The reason for this is that they can get easily damaged or lost and this can cause unnecessary upset that can impact on behaviour or learning for the rest of the day. We have also had problems with children wanting to 'trade' or swap items (cards, small toys) without parents' permission, or they swap and then realise that they want their item back! This causes upset for both parties.



Mrs Kee has spoken to a couple of children who have said that children are allowed to trade at Edge Hill. Mrs Kee has explained that children at Edge Hill are older and, at Violet Way, we are not allowed to swap and trade items from home. Mrs Kee has said that, once collected by their parents, if parents are together with the children, then they can talk to them if they would like to swap, and parents can then make that decision. The children accepted and understood this.

Considerate Parking

Please can all parents be mindful of where they are parking during drop off and collection. We have received reports from local residents where parents have parked in front of driveways. It is important to show 'We care' and be considerate of our local residents. They need to have access in and out of their own property. In addition, I have been shocked and surprised to hear that some parents of pupils at Violet Way have parked over driveways and then, when asked by residents to move, they have become aggressive. Please be considerate of our local residents.
