

My child enjoys reading at home





What do you feel you gained from attending the parents reading session (annonymised)

- > I know how to explain the letters (funny rhyme)
- How you represent the letters was very enjoyable for the kids I will definitely try it
- It's the first time I've been in an active teaching class, and I loved seeing them all learning. It was also great to hoe the reading teacher breaks things down for the children.
