









## **Lovely Learning**






## A Message from the Headteacher

#### **CURRENT SITUATION**

Thank you for your patience with regards to the proposed industrial action. I have been reading the guidance and I am hoping that we will be able to be open to all pupils, however I cannot offer any guarantees at this point. Following my meeting with the Trust next week, I will be in a position to provide further details.

Even if we do have teachers on strike, we may still be able to remain open, however parents should be aware of the following:

- On this day, your child may work in a different class for part or all of the day.
- Your child may be doing different work from their usual sequence of lessons.
- Safety of children will be paramount at all points of the day, correct adult:child ratios will be adhered to.

I am aware this advice at this point may appear brief, but please bear in mind that staff are not obliged to share with me their intentions regarding striking. Although we will endeavour to remain open for all, depending on whether we have any teachers striking, and the number, we may be in a position where some classes may close. As Headteacher, I am in the difficult position of managing the teachers legal right to strike, and my duty toward the education and wellbeing of the pupils.

I hope you can appreciate this is a complex situation and plans may be subject to change. Please be assured I will keep you informed of any changes and provide further details following the Trust meeting on Tuesday.



It begins with a fun-filled workshop on Saturday 11th February and a week full of activities after that.


