
A Message from Mrs Kee

At Violet Way this week, we took part in Children's Mental Health Week. The focus was about making connections. Over the week, the children engaged in a range of planned activities to help them learn about healthy connections — to family, friends and others — and how this can support our mental health and our sense of wellbeing. This week was also a time for children to learn about online safety, including talking about their experiences of life online. Many games that children play involve talking to others online and, although this can be a great experience and opportunity for children to socialise, it can also lead to unkind words and behaviours online. We teach children what respectful online behaviours look like and what to do if someone is being unkind to them online. Our school council pupils started their 'Playground Leader' training this week and the trainer was very impressed with their contributions and positive attitude!

Children's Mental Health Week 2023

We started our Children's Mental Health Week with an assembly watching a short animation of <u>Lucy's Blue Day</u> which is based on the story by Chris Duke. Lucy is a very special little girl with magical hair. It changes colour with her emotions. If she is feeling happy, it is purple. If she is jealous, it will turn green. This charming



story is the tale of when Lucy wakes up and her hair is blue, and she doesn't understand why. She soon learns that it is OK not to be OK. We used the story as inspiration for discussing themes such as loneliness, friendship and how we make connections with others and how that makes us feel. The children thought about people in their own lives that they can talk to when they are feeling 'blue'. Over the week, the children engaged in a range of activities to promote positive mental health and making meaningful connections.

This Spring term, we are going to be hosting a disco on **Thursday 9th March** from 5pm-6pm for our **Reception** children!


