A Message from Mrs Kee

As part of their curriculum, the children in Year 1 are learning about the Victorians during this half term. This week they have explored some Victorian artefacts and their purposes. They have read about the life of a Victorian child and made comparisons to their own lives. During their Victorian experience day today, the children (and teachers) dressed up in Victorian attire. The classrooms were altered to look like a Victorian classroom and the children played with Victorian toys at breaktime. It was a great opportunity to enable pupils to develop their understanding of the similarities and differences between a Victoria child's life and present day. Thank you to all the staff that made it happen!

Our target for attendance is 96% and our whole school attendance figure this week was 96%! Research has shown a strong correlation between attendance and attainment (Attendance and Attainment: a five year study) and promoting excellent attendance is the responsibility of the whole school community. Improving attendance is in everyone's interests and it is everyone's responsibility. Overall, our attendance year to date is 94% so we are certainly close to our target. If anyone has any concerns or needs support regarding their child's attendance, please let us know.

Mental Health Awareness Week

The Mental Health Foundation's, 'Mental Health Awareness week is from 15th to 21st May and the theme is anxiety. Anxiety is a normal emotion in us all, but sometimes it can get out of control and become a mental health problem. Lots of things can lead to feelings of anxiety, including relationships, starting a new job (or losing one) or other big life events. We can also get anxious

when it comes to things to do with money and not being able to meet our basic needs, like heating our home or buying food.

Anxiety is one of the most common mental health problems we can face. In a recent mental health survey carried out by the Mental Health Foundation around stress, anxiety and hopelessness over personal finances, a quarter of adults said they felt so anxious that it stopped them from doing the things they want to do some or all of the time. Six in ten adults feel this way, at least some of the time. On a positive note, anxiety can be made easier to manage.

Focusing on anxiety for this year's Mental Health Awareness Week will increase people's awareness and understanding of anxiety by providing information on the things that can help prevent it from becoming a problem.
