

## A Message from Mrs Kee

What a great first week back after the half term break. On Monday, our whole school assembly was focused on our final Jigsaw PSHE unit, 'Changing Me'. We began by listening to Nina Simone's Feeling Good, reflecting on the positive feelings a 'new day' can bring. The children then listened carefully to a story all about a character whose tummy was 'feeling fizzy' because he was growing older, and changes were happening that he was feeling worried about. The character's birthday was coming up, he had grown out of his favourite shoes and was going to be starting a new gymnastics class. We talked about important strategies to help us when we get that 'fizzy feeling' in our tummies. The first being to accept that change happens as we grow and, although we might not have control over some changes, we do have control over how we approach and handle change. Secondly, it is important to remember changes we have already been through and coped well with. Finally, preparing for changes can be supportive. In terms of our pupils, we know they face a change as they transition into their next year group. At Violet Way, we have carefully planned transition procedures to prepare pupils for this inevitable change. Y2 pupils have a number of key dates for transition and in this week's newsletter I have included staffing for September so that YR and Y1 parents and pupils know which class they will be going to next academic year and who their teacher will be. Our transition plans allow for children to enjoy their final half term learning in their current class whilst preparing them for next year by offering opportunities to spend time in new classrooms and with their new teachers over this half term. ## Slap on the Sunscreen!

Although the weather has been variable, please keep an eye on the weather forecast and, if in doubt, slap on the sunscreen!

Parent should apply a high factor sun cream to your child before they come to school. The weather is getting warmer and children will need a sunhat and a water bottle to ensure they keep hydrated.



We will encourage children to seek shaded areas if it gets particularly hot. Please remember that children should still wear long trousers for Forest School (joggers or leggings).

## Friendships and Fall-outs

At Violet Way, all staff encourage, promote and positively reinforce our expectations for learning and behaviour. As a result, children behave well and follow our golden rules. However, they are children, and part of learning includes learning about behaviour. As they learn, grow and experience, children will have disagreements with others, struggle sharing, have difficulty with losing and may sometimes say or do things they don't mean.


We always seek a peaceful solution to situations of conflict. We encourage children to talk to each other about how they are feeling. Children are encouraged to find a peaceful solution to their issues through talking. Adults can support pupils by guiding them through a restorative conversation, helping them to develop the skills required to discover a friendly resolution.

At this time of year, children can sometimes be a little anxious about the changes ahead. As Mrs Kee explained in her message at the start of the newsletter this week, we carefully plan to guide children through these changes and give them strategies they can utilise to support their own emotions and well-being. Children are also often more resilient than we realise! However, there can still be disagreements, falling out and problems between friends because they are a little more sensitive than usual.

We make sure we take time to remind children of our expectations and how to respond if someone is doing or saying something they don't like. Children are asked to use their words and tell others "Please don't do (or say) that, I don't like it" if they are not happy.

We help children to distinguish between falling out and bullying by using the following language: 'fall out', 'disagreement', 'nasty incident', 'bullying' and always encourage them to talk to an adult if they feel unconformable, worried or upset. Even if they have just had a 'fall out' with a friend, this can be upsetting, and they may need some guidance to talk with the other child and resolve the issue.

## **Threadworms – information for parents**

We have had a few parents reporting cases of threadworms. Threadworms (pinworms) are tiny worms in your poo. They're common in children and spread easily (like many childhood illnesses) but you can treat them without seeing a GP. There is no need to keep children off school if they have threadworms. The information from the Health Protection Agency and NHS is 'if you or your child has threadworms there's no need to stay off nursery, school or work'. At school, to prevent the spread of germs and infections, we encourage healthy hygiene routines and have hand wash and hand rub available in every classroom.

It is important that parents also encourage good hygiene routines at home. The main thing is to stress the importance of good hygiene to your children. Teaching children to wash their hands after going to the toilet and before meals will help to prevent spreading of germs. It is also a good idea to keep fingernails short. Advice is to try not to get too worried about threadworms as they are very common and no matter how vigilant you are they can be hard to avoid.

## **Parking and Local Community**

The County Council have received an alarming, unprecedented number of complaints from local residents and parents regarding inconsiderate, illegal and dangerous parking by parents/guardians transporting their children to school.

Please be safe and considerate

We thank the many families who choose to walk, cycle or scoot to school and those that choose to 'Park and Stride', parking further away from the school in a safe considerate manner and walking the remaining distance to school.

However, a growing minority are choosing to drive to school and park very close to the school gates, often parking illegally or on the 'keep clear' zigzags and parking with disregard towards local residents – the school's neighbours.

The Parking Enforcement team have been inundated with requests to visit hot spots to try and alleviate this problem and are visiting problem areas as often as they can.

At Violet Way, we are taking steps to encourage and reinforce this message, including reminders in the newsletter, parking buddies at the front of school and Marvellous Me messages.

Thinking about our local community, can we ask that parents are considerate when dropping off and collecting children from school. Let's show our community that 'we care' by parking cars considerately. This means not parking over driveways, blocking exits or parking in turning spaces. If you are waiting in a car, please switch your engine off so that we don't have unnecessary fumes polluting the air around our school. Where possible, you could encourage you child to walk or scoot to school with you.
