Year 2 trip 2024 (current Y1 pupils) - Update

A Microsoft Form survey was sent to current Year 1 parents regarding the residential trip for Y2 pupils next academic year. We had a large number of responses, and the majority would prefer for their child to attend a residential trip at the end of the year rather than an alternative.

We have researched providers within Staffordshire and have found that Kingswood, as well as being a LOTC (Learning Outside the Classroom) Quality Badge provider, is the best value for money and offer an experience suitable for infant-aged pupils. The trip is always very popular with pupils and a great experience for them at the end of the Violet Way adventure! As a result, we have decided to book this trip for June 2024. The dates of the Kingswood trip next year will be $3^{\rm rd}$ - $5^{\rm th}$ July 2024. On the way there, the children stop off to visit Cosford Museum.

We understand that we will not please everyone all of the time and that whilst many pupils and parents would want to attend a residential trip, some may prefer not to. As such, we do plan activities in school for the pupils not attending. The trip will be from Wednesday to Friday in June (dates will be confirmed) and includes a range of outdoor activities, for example, zip wire, minibeast hunt, climbing, campfires, team games. We will provide more information in the Autumn term to parents. and ensure that the cost of the trip is spread over the academic year to support parents in planning for payment. BE WATER AWARE

Drowning prevention and water safety

Don't be tempted to cool off in Rivers, Canals, Lakes or Reservoirs as swimming in open water can result in drowning

If you see someone in the water


- Call 999 and ask for fire and ambulance. Ask for the Coastguard if by the sea.
- Location give as much information on your location, look for landmarks, signs or bridges or use WHAT THREE WORDS service to find your location.
- Three words for a faster emergency response | what3words
- · Stay on the telephone to the emergency services.
- Tell the person in the water to float on their back, extend arms & legs & to move hands and feet to stay afloat.
- · Use lifesaving equipment such as lifebuoy or throw line if close by.
- NEVER ENTER THE WATER TO SAVE SOMEONE ELSE or an ANIMAL

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During the school holidays, and in particular in hot weather, increasing numbers of children are drowning. On average, there are 50 of these tragedies each year in the U.K.

Keep reading to see our top tips on how to stay safe around open water.



Water is often far deeper than people think. Only swim where there is supervision or a lifeguard. Water that looks calm on the surface may have a fast current underneath.



It's very cold and can quickly cause cramp and breathing difficulties.

Cold water shock can paralyse your ability to move and kill within a
minute



The depth of water can be deceptive and may contain hidden rubbish and debris such as shopping trolleys or broken glass which can cause injuries and drowning.



Sometimes it can be polluted and make you ill. There is a serious risk of waterborne diseases
