

A Message from Mrs Kee

We started the week with an assembly about this half term's 'Jigsaw' PSHE unit 'Being me in my world'. We identified how we can use our words and actions and what we say to be kind to someone else, making links to our school value 'We care' and our Golden Rule 'We have kind hands, kind feet and kind words'. Over the half term, the children will learn that our choices have an impact on others. They will develop an understanding of rewards and consequences and find out how to deal with worries.

Our Reception children have had their first full week in school, including two days where they walked to their classes without parents. We are very proud of how they are settling into Violet Way — well done! To enable the children in Reception to get used to their morning routine, parent library sessions for Reception pupils won't start until after the half term break. Year 1 and Year 2 parent library mornings start next week.

They have been welcomed by the staff and pupils and have made a great start in their different roles at Violet Way. Allergen Policy

All parents should be aware that we have an Allergen Policy, which can be found on our website <u>policy page</u>. Some key important notes for parents:

- It the parent's responsibility to inform the school of any allergies by completing the new entrant's form.
- Parents are responsible for ensuring any required medication is supplied, in date and replaced as necessary
- For the protection of the children in our schools no nuts will be allowed in any area at any time. This includes any food that contains Nutella® or similar, peanut butter or any other foods containing nuts. These restrictions also apply to any packed lunches and snacks that are created or sent in from home (The Academy cannot check all lunchboxes and items brought into school, therefore will take measures as reasonably practicable)
- Products that are labelled "May contain nuts" will be accepted into schools as these
 pose minimal risk are labelled to protect the manufacturer.

Parent and Carers Communication and Email Protocol

As advised in the CEO's message to parents last week, there is now a Trust-wide Parent Communication and Email Protocol on our <u>policy page</u>. When communicating by email staff want to respond to parental queries at the earliest opportunity and will do their utmost to do so, however, the majority of teachers' time is taken up teaching and preparing for lessons. Some key points below:

- There is no expectation for staff to answer emails outside school hours and there is a Trust expectation that this is followed by all.
- Emails sent by parents must have the expectation that they may not be answered outside of the agreed period from 8.00am-6.00pm or over a weekend. This is to encourage a better work-life balance for our staff and to make parents think carefully about the emails they are sending.
- Staff are not expected to check emails before 8.00am or after 6.00pm on working days, or over the weekend.
- In terms of replies to parents, we expect that any emails are responded to within a three working day period. Staff may not always monitor their email accounts during the school holidays, so they may not be able to respond within three working days during these periods.





Community Meeting

On Tuesday this week, Mrs Kee attended a meeting at Paulet High School with Mr McArthur (Paulet Headteacher), Conor Wileman (County Councillor), Jane Winfield (PSCO), and representatives from Brizlincote Parish Council and the local neighbourhood. The purpose of the meeting was the share ideas about how to improve the parking issues in the local vicinity of the school, including car idling (due to the pollution it causes) and inconsiderate and illegal parking.

As a school, we regularly promote and encourage parents to walk to school with children or, if driving is necessary, to park safely and considerately of local residents. This means parking in a way that considers the safety of pedestrians, not blocking driveways or exits to homes and following the rules of the highway.

Working with our local community is really important to us and pupils. Our pupils often show 'We care' by collecting litter in their local environment, and partaking in 'walk to school' weeks, for example.

During the meeting, we agreed to share information around school event days as we are aware these can cause increased cars on the road. We have suggested that local residents can check our weekly newsletters for further information. However, we appreciate that some residents may not access the internet, so we request that parents living locally, particularly in the cul-desacs opposite the schools, communicate events that they are aware of with their neighbours.

It is important that parents do not sit in running cars and we support the Staffordshire 'Anti-Idling' campaign. This is because we want to reduce the amount of pollution in the air that our pupils are breathing in. Poor air quality can seriously aggravate conditions like asthma and it's responsible for hundreds of deaths a year across Staffordshire. You can help make a change! Choosing to switch off your engine whilst waiting in your car is a simple change you can make straight away.



Parent Reading Meeting

If you want to find out more about phonics and reading at Violet Way, there are two meetings planned for parents. On **Thursday 5**th **October** there will be a meeting at **9:00am and 4:30pm.** We have planned two meeting so parents can choose which suits them. You are welcome to pop in. If you are unable to attend, please do not worry as we will be publishing the meeting slides on the website.

At Violet Way, children bring home a reading book and a library book.

Books should be brought to school daily in their book bag.

- Reading books will be changed on Mondays and returned to children on Tuesday.
 Please ensure your child's reading book is in school on Monday.
- Library books are changed on Tuesdays in Reception, Wednesdays in Year 2 and Thursdays in Year 1.

Please be aware that, depending on their stage of reading, children may be set different reading challenges at home. Reception will start their phonics learning in school after a few weeks of settling in and reading books for Reception will start being sent home after October half term. Children in Reception will still have a library book for you to enjoy reading together at home.

Remember that the parent library sessions start next week for Year 1 and Year 2. We look forward to welcoming you and your child. During these sessions, please can parents help the children to put the books back in the correct place! There are labels to help you on the shelves. Thank you!
