





## A Message from Mrs Kee



### **NHS Flu Vaccinations**

### The Childhood Flu Vaccination Programme 2023 - NHS School Immunisation Service

This vaccination is to help protect your child against flu. Flu is a virus which can make you feel very unwell and can cause serious complications. Vaccinating your child will also help protect more vulnerable family members and friends by preventing the spread of flu.

This vaccination is free. It is a quick and simple spray up the nose. Even if your child had it last year, they should have the flu vaccine again this year. The nasal vaccine is offered to children as it is more effective than the injected vaccine. For further information click <a href="here">here</a>. The vaccine is delivered by nurses during the school day on 17<sup>th</sup> October, only if parents had completed the NHS online consent form (see below).

Children will only receive the flu vaccine if parents have provided consent online using the NHS form link above.




# **Toddler group information**

# E-Bike and E- Scooter Safety



Most E-bikes and e-scooters are powered by lithium-ion batteries which can be charged in the home. It is important to charge e-bikes and e-scooters safely to avoid a fire and outing your home and family at risk

- Follow the manufacturer's instructions when charging and always unplug the charger when it's finished charging
- Charge batteries whilst you are awake do not charge while you are asleep or away from the home
- Always use the manufacturer approved charger and buy an official replacement charge if it becomes damaged
- · Do not cover chargers or battery packs when charging as this could lead to a fire
- Do not charge batteries or store your e-bike or scooter near combustible or flammable materials.
- Do not overcharge your battery- check the manufacturer's instructions on charge times
- Do not overload sockets or use inappropriate extension leads
- If you charge your e-bike or scooter in a garage or kitchen, ensure you install detection we
  recommend heat alarms rather than smoke alarms for these areas.
- Ensure you have working smoke alarms
- In the event of an e-bike, e-scooter, or lithium-ion battery fire do not attempt to extinguish the fire
- GET OUT, STAY OUT and call 999
- Avoid storing or charging e-bikes or e-scooters on escape routes or in communal areas of a multi
  occupied building. If there is a fire, it can affect people's ability to escape.
- Responsible Persons should consider the risks posed by e-bikes and e-scooters where they are charged or left in common areas such as means of escape, bike and mobility scooter charging rooms.
- Store e-bikes and e-scooters and their batteries in a cool place. Avoid excessively hot or cold places.
- Follow manufacturer's instructions for the storage and maintenance of lithium-ion batteries if they are not going to be used for some time.

- Buy e-bikes, e-scooters, chargers and batteries from reputable retailers
- Many fires involve counterfeit electrical goods.
- Items which don't meet British or European standards pose a huge fire risk.
- · Genuine chargers may cost more but it is not worth putting your life at risk or destroying your home by buying a fake charger.
- If buying a conversion kit, purchase from a reputable seller and check it complies with British or European standards
- Register your product with the manufacturer to validate any warranties
- Check for any product recalls. You can do this by checking Electrical Safety First

- Batteries can be damaged by dropping them or crashing e-bikes or e-scooters
- When the battery is damaged it can overheat and catch fire without warning. Check your battery regularly.
- Replace it if you suspect it is damaged
- Check with your manufacturer or local authority for suitable battery recycling arrangements in

# Electric fire safety tips

- Do not overload plug sockets
- Always use the correct fuse to prevent overheating
- When using a tumble dryer make sure you clean the filter and remove any fluff
- Don't leave a washing machine or tumble dryer on when you are asleep
- Don't leave a washing machine or tumble dryer on when no one is in the property.
- Keep all appliances clean and in good working order.
- Always use the correct charger for all electric devices and unplug when not being used.
- Find out if any of your electrical products have been recalled on the

- Reading books will be changed on Mondays and returned to children on Tuesday.
   Please ensure your child's reading book is in school on Monday.
- Library books are changed on Tuesdays in Reception, Wednesdays in Year 2 and Thursdays in Year 1.

Please be aware that, depending on their stage of reading, children may be set different reading challenges at home. Reception will start their phonics learning in school after a few weeks of settling in and reading books for Reception will start being sent home after October half term. Children in Reception will still have a library book for you to enjoy reading together at home.
