Parent Library Mornings - Update

Following the feedback from the reading meeting with parents, we have ensured that the Computing suite is not set up for music lessons until after the parent library session, allowing more space for parents to sit with their child to read. We hope that this has made our ever-popular sessions more comfortable. We plan to see how this goes over the next few weeks.

Mrs Kee has spoken to Headteachers across the Trust and regular parent library sessions are not being offered at the other academies currently. In response to recent feedback, we plan to continue to run them as they are, with the Computing suite open at every session. Mrs Kee will pop into some of the sessions to see if this has helped to ease some of the congestion identified by some parents.



Birthday treats

As a school, through our curriculum, we encourage healthy lifestyles, including healthy eating. In Design and Technology, the children make salads and breakfast pots in KS1, for example. For these lessons, our kitchen team provide the ingredients and ensure that appropriate adjustments are made as needed for any children with allergies or intolerances. We take this seriously as some allergies can cause illness or be life threatening. We manage this through the kitchen catering team who provide suitable school meals, adjusting menus as appropriate to ensure children's individual dietary requirements are met. This also applies to when we have biscuit or cake treat decorating for Mother's and Father's Day play and stay sessions.

Although we understand that parents like to send in treats for their child's birthdays for staff to hand out at the end of the day, after consulting with the Trust Catering Lead and other academies within the Trust, we have decided that we cannot facilitate this anymore in school. Over the last few years, the Trust have continued to provide guidance and support to ensure that our practices help to keep all the children safe. Our prize boxes for Marvellous me and reading rockets are nonfood items and we will also ensure that teachers and staff in school do not buy food treats for pupils moving forwards and instead provide non-food items where applicable. For Easter, the PTA provide chocolate eggs, however, these are purchased by the catering team who provide alternatives as required.

From this point forwards, please <u>do not</u> send treats into school for birthdays. As an alternative to sending in treats, we will have a basket in the school library where parents can donate a book for their child, in their name, for their birthday. If parents send in a book, we will add a sticker stating, 'This book was donated for's birthday.' The book can be sent into class.

If parents do want to provide treats for their child's class, you can hand out treats offsite if you wish, however this would be at your own risk, and it does leave you potentially liable.

This information will also be provided in a letter to all parents and added to the website.

Since September, any volunteers for trips (other than when parents support walking to the church or Edge Hill) will need to have DBS (Disclosure and Barring Service) check. Volunteers will be asked to complete an application and provide identification documents, which these will be used for the DBS check. The school will fund all DBS checks for volunteers.
